

## **Audition SONGS**

As this is a "*GOLDEN AGE" musical (a show title that was released in the 1940's or 1950's),* the Directing Team requests that all auditioning students present a *specific type of song* for their <u>ONE MINUTE vocal audition</u>. An instrumental-only accompaniment (without others singing) track is required and must be downloaded on your own device for practice at home and for use at auditions.

- **Ages 13-18** may choose your own Golden Age song <u>OR</u> choose any song from the list of recommended show titles (below).
- **Ages 8-12** may choose your own age-appropriate Golden Age song <u>OR</u> select any song from the list of recommendations (below).

## <u>TIPS</u>

- Your song should be fully memorized and be about one minute in length this usually consists of one verse and the refrain/chorus.
- Review the listed show/song suggestions, or choose your own song **from any <u>golden age</u> musical (this is something released in the 1940's or 1950's).** Choose a song that you connect with, that highlights the best parts of your singing voice, and is appropriate for your age and potential character type.
- Find a karaoke track to practice with at home by googling "karaoke track" with your song title, or look it up on youtube. We want to hear you, not the background singers, so make sure it's an instrumental-only track.
- Download the music track to your device for quick and easy access when practicing and when auditioning.
- *Bring your device with your downloaded song* to hook up to our speaker at your audition (we do provide the audio attachments).
